**Re: No Action Closure Letter**  
**FPPC Case No. 2018-01108;**  
**Citizens for Sound Governance at PUSD and Kimberely Beatty**

Dear Ms. Beatty:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).<sup>1</sup> The Enforcement Division received a complaint alleging that you were responsible for paying for and distributing a doorhanger advertisement opposing two candidates in the November 6, 2018 General Election for the Poway Unified School District Board of Directors. Specifically, the allegation was that you had failed to file as a committee and disclose your political activity and/or the political contributions and expenditures of others, in violation of the Act.

After an investigation, the Enforcement Division has determined that there is insufficient evidence that a violation has occurred. In order to fall under the jurisdiction of the Act, the person or persons responsible for the door hanger must qualify as a committee. The threshold for an independent expenditure committee is spending \$1,000 or more in a calendar year. The threshold for a recipient committee is spending \$2,000 or more in a calendar year. There is insufficient evidence that either threshold was met with regard to the door hanger in question. Therefore, we have closed our investigation in this matter.
