Filing Schedule for the County of Marin Committees Primarily Formed to Support/Oppose Local Measures Listed on the January 27, 2026 Ballot

File if a contribution of \$1,000 or more in the aggregate is made to or in connection with another candidate or another measure listed on the January 27, 2026, ballot, or made to a political party committee. The recipient of a non-monetary contribution of \$1,000 or more in the aggregate must file a Form 497 within 48 hours of receiving the contribution. Must be filed electronically.
Dec 18, 2025 <i>1st Pre-Election</i>	* – 12/13/25	460	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All committees must file this statement. Must be filed electronically.
<u>If combining second pre-election and semi-annual:</u> Jan 15, 2026 <i>2nd Pre-Election and Semi-Annual</i>	12/14/25 – 1/10/26	460	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All committees must file these statements. The second pre-election and semi-annual statements <i>may</i> be combined. Filers using an electronic filing system will likely have to file two separate statements. If the second pre-election and semi-annual statements are combined, the period covered is December 14, 2025 through January 10, 2026. If filing two separate statements, the period covered for the semi-annual statement is December 14, 2025 through December 31, 2025. The period covered for the second pre-election statement is January 1, 2026, through January 10, 2026. The January 31 semi-annual filing deadline falls on a Saturday, so the deadline is extended to the next business day. Must be filed electronically.

Depending on committee activity, the following reports may also be required:

[460](#) - **Ballot Measure Quarterly Report:** Quarterly campaign reports are required prior to the semi-annual period in which pre-election reports must be filed.

Additional Notes:

- ***Period Covered:** The period covered by any statement begins on the day after the closing date of the last statement filed, or January 1, if no previous statement has been filed.
- **Local Ordinance:** The County of Marin has electronic filing requirements. ([Marin County Municipal Code](#), Ch. 2.01.)
- ****Deadline Extensions:** Deadlines are extended when they fall on a Saturday, Sunday, or an official state holiday. This extension does not apply to a 24-hour/10-day Contribution Report (Form 497) due the weekend before the election, and this extension never applies to any 24-hour/10-day Independent Expenditure Report (Form 496). Such reports must be filed within 24 hours, regardless of the day of the week.
- **Method of Delivery:** Unless otherwise noted, all paper filings may be filed by personal delivery or first-class mail. A paper copy of a statement may not be required if a local agency requires online filing pursuant to a local ordinance.
- **Other Committee Expenditures:** Contact the FPPC if the committee makes independent expenditures/contributions to candidates and/or other measures. Additional reports may be required.
- **Multipurpose Organizations (including non-profits):** A multipurpose organization that uses its general dues account to make contributions or expenditures may qualify as a major donor or independent expenditure committee and may be required to report payments on Campaign [Form 461](#). Such an organization will qualify as a recipient committee if expenditures exceed \$50,000 in a 12-month period or \$100,000 in four consecutive calendar years. An organization that qualifies as a recipient committee may need to file reports disclosing contributors. - **Public Documents:** All statements and reports are public documents.

- **Committee Status:** See FPPC [Regulation 18247.5](#) to determine if a committee is primarily formed.
- **Form 511 – Paid Spokesperson Report:** File within 10 days of making either of the following expenditures related to an advertisement to support or oppose a ballot measure: 1) A payment totaling \$5,000 or more to an individual to appear in an advertisement, or 2) A payment of any amount to an individual portraying a member of a licensed occupation (e.g., nurse, doctor, firefighter).
