Dear Mr. Harison:

The Fair Political Practices Commission ("Commission") enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the "Act").¹ The Commission's Enforcement Division reviewed the campaign statements and reports of the Wine Country Committee Against Proposition 8 (the "Committee") to determine whether the Committee complied with the Act's requirements for ballot measure committees.

The Enforcement Division concluded that the Committee complied with the naming requirements of Section 84107, which requires that a committee primarily formed to support or oppose a ballot measure include in its name that the committee supports or opposes the specified ballot measure. Additionally, the Committee was found to have filed all campaign statements and reports as required by Section 84200, et seq. and to have terminated its filing requirements in compliance with Section 84214.

The FPPC has completed its review in the above-referenced matter. The Commission has found no violation of the Act. If you have any questions regarding this matter, please contact me at (916) 322-5796.
