No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2022-00644; Janet Lewis

Dear Janet Lewis:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”). As you are aware, the Enforcement Division received a referral from California Correctional Health Care Services (“CCHCS”) alleging that you failed to timely file your 2020 and 2021 Annual Statements of Economic Interests (“SEIs”).

Because it appeared the notifications regarding your 2020 and 2021 Annual SEIs were sent to your CDCR email address which is “inactive,” the Enforcement Division contacted you regarding the requirement to file the 2020 and 2021 Annual SEIs as a retired annuitant/Health Program Manager III. Immediately upon receiving the notification, you responded and filed the missing SEIs. For this reason, and because you worked very limited hours, we are closing this matter without further action. Although the Enforcement Division is closing this matter without seeking a penalty, you are still required to pay any late filing fees assessed by your filing officer, CCHCS.
