Re: No Action Closure Letter FPPC No. 2022-00387; Adam Raymond

Dear Adam Raymond:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“FPPC”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a referral from the FPPC’s Statements of Economic Interests (“SEI”) Unit regarding your failure to timely file an Assuming Office SEI for your position as a Planning Commission with the City of Colton.

The Enforcement Division found that you filed a 2020 Annual SEI on February 4, 2021 and a 2021 Annual SEI on March 3, 2022, before you were contacted by the Enforcement Division. Because the reporting period for your Assuming Office SEI is January 19, 2020 through January 19, 2021, the period was completely covered by the 2020 and 2021 Annual SEIs. Additionally, you have since amended your 2020 Annual SEI to make it an Assuming Office SEI. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action. Although the Enforcement Division is closing this matter without seeking a penalty, you are still required to pay any late filing fees assessed by your filing officer, the FPPC’s SEI Unit.
