The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the "Act").¹ This letter is in response to an AdWatch submission alleging California Labor Federation, AFL-CIO ("CA Labor Fed") violated the Act's advertisement disclosure provisions when it distributed a mailer in advance of the September 14, 2021 Gubernatorial Recall Election.

The Enforcement Division completed its investigation and has decided to close its file on this matter without further action because the allegations have been disproven. The advertisement distributed by the CA Labor Fed was a member communication, and therefore is not subject to the Act's advertisement disclosure provisions.
