Dear Mr. Chan:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“FPPC”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a referral from the Department of Financial Protection and Innovation (“DFPI”) regarding your failure to timely file a 2019 Annual Statement of Economic Interests (“SEI”) for your position as Records Management Analyst I with DFPI.

The Enforcement Division found that you filed the missing SEI on November 4, 2020, before you were contacted by the Enforcement Division. For this reason, we are closing this matter with no further action. Although the Enforcement Division is closing this matter without seeking a penalty, you are still required to pay any late filing fees assessed by your filing officer, DFPI.
