Dear Committee, Tim Tom, and Jeffrey Yoshioka:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act¹ (the “Act”). This letter is in response to a referral from the Santa Clara County Registrar of Voters alleging that your committee failed to timely file its semi-annual campaign statement covering the period of July 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021.

The Enforcement Division found that you filed the missing statement on February 28, 2022, before you were contacted by the Enforcement Division. For this reason, we are closing this matter without further action. Although the Enforcement Division is closing this matter without seeking a penalty, you are still required to pay any late filing fees assessed by your filing officer, the Santa Clara County Registrar of Voters.
