Dear Ms. Parker:

As you are aware, the Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) received a referral from the Commission’s Statements of Economic Interests (“SEI”) Unit regarding your failure to timely file your 2020 Annual and Leaving Office SEIs as a Monterey County Supervisor. We found that you left your position as a Monterey County Supervisor in December 2020, so you were not required to file a 2020 Annual SEI, but you were required to file a Leaving Office SEI within 30 days of leaving your position.

Because it appeared that the notifications regarding your 2020 Annual and Leaving Office SEIs were sent to your former agency’s email address after you left office, the Enforcement Division contacted you regarding the requirement to file a Leaving Office SEI. Immediately after you received the notification, you responded and filed your Leaving Office SEI. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action. Although the Enforcement Division is closing this matter without seeking a penalty, you are still required to pay any late filing fees assessed by your filing officer, the Commission’s SEI Unit.
