Re: No Action Closure Letter FPPC No. 2022-00360; Roxana Bonderson

Dear Ms. Bonderson,

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a sworn complaint alleging your failure to disclose certain economic interests on your Assuming Office Statement of Economic Interests (“SEI”), 2020 Annual SEI, and 2021 Annual SEI. The Enforcement Division has completed its review and determined that you failed to disclose a reportable source of income to your business of \$10,000 or more on your 2021 Annual SEI.

The Enforcement Division also found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (PREP) course regarding Statements of Economic Interests (SEI). In addition, you have amended your SEIs to both remove some unrequired information and to correctly disclose a reportable economic interest.
