RE: Closure Letter: FPPC Case No. 2019/01359; In the Matter of Charlene Wardlow

Dear Charlene Wardlow:

The Enforcement Division of the California Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to our case concerning a Commission-initiated complaint regarding potential conflicts of interests when overseeing oil and gas permits in the position of Supervising Oil and Gas Engineer-Northern District and Geothermal Deputy of the Department of Conservation’s Division of Oil, Gas and Geothermal Resources at a time you owned stock of between \$2,000 and \$10,000 in Valero Energy Corp., Exelon Corp., BP PLC Sponsored ADR, Duke Energy and Exxon Mobil Corp.

The Enforcement Division investigation found insufficient evidence that you made, participated in or oversaw the approval of oil and gas permits in connection with businesses in which you owned stock. Additionally, the investigation determined that the small shareholder exception applied in this matter.² As such, the allegations have been disproven, and the Enforcement Division has decided to close this matter without further action.
