No Action Closure Letter, FPPC No. 2018-01228: Fairfield Suisun Unified Teachers Association PAC, Maria Geluz, Craig Wilson

Dear Craig Wilson:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to two sworn complaints alleging you and the Fairfield-Suisun Teachers Association PAC (the “Committee”) coordinated to produce mailers supporting your candidacy and failed to include proper “not authorized by” disclosures. After conducting our investigation and review of the case, we are closing this matter without further action.

The Enforcement Division’s investigation found that Craig Wilson did not coordinate with the Committee in the production of the mailers supporting his candidacy. Consequently, because the Enforcement Division determined you to be in compliance, the allegations have been disproven.
