No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2020-00050; Julia Hernandez

Dear Julia Hernandez:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a referral from the County of Fresno regarding your failure to timely file your 2019 and 2020 Annual Statement of Economic Interests (“SEIs”) for your positions as a Board Member for Fresno County Regional Transportation Mitigation Fee Agency (RTMFA), Fresno Council of Governments (COG) and Fresno County Rural Transit Agency (RTA)

The Enforcement Division found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (“PREP”) course regarding Statements of Economic Interests. In addition, you have filed the missing SEIs. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action. Although the Enforcement Division is closing this matter without seeking a penalty, you are still required to pay any late filing fees assessed by your filing officer, the County of Fresno.
