The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).<sup>1</sup> This letter is in response to a commission-initiated matter that determined you failed to disclose certain economic interests on your Statements of Economic Interests (“SEIs”) for your position as a Board Member with the Ontario-Montclair School District.

The Enforcement Division found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (PREP) course regarding SEIs. In addition, you had already filed amendments to your SEIs to disclose your reportable economic interests. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action.
