**No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC Case Nos. 2023-00035 & 2021-00077; Robert Coker**

Dear Mr. Coker:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).<sup>1</sup> This letter is in response to two referrals from the Commission’s Statements of Economic Interests (“SEI”) Unit regarding your failure to timely file your 2019 Annual and 2021 Annual SEIs for your position as a Planning Commissioner with the City of Clearlake.

The Enforcement Division found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (PREP) course regarding SEIs. In addition, you have filed the missing SEIs. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action. Although the Enforcement Division is closing this matter without seeking a penalty, you are still required to pay any late filing fees assessed by your filing officer, the Commission’s SEI Unit.
