No Action Closure Letter Re: FPPC No. 2021-01098; Fairness for Injured Patients Act Coalition, Jakob Norman

Dear Jakob Norman:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the "Act").¹ This letter is in response to a sworn complaint submitted that alleged video advertisements in support of Fairness for Injured Patients Act that was intended to be voted on in the November 3, 2020 General Election, but was removed from the ballot, did not contain the proper disclosures. After conducting our investigation and review of the case, we are closing this matter without further action as the allegations have been disproven.

The Enforcement Division's investigation confirmed you did not pay for the advertisement. Therefore, disclosures from the Fairness for Injured Patients Act Coalition committee were not required and no violation occurred.
