No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2020-00415; Rebecca Grajski

Dear Gary Winuk:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to an anonymous complaint alleging that your client, Rebecca Grajski, failed to disclose certain economic interests on their Statements of Economic Interests (“SEIs”), for their position as a Director of Administration for the State Treasurer’s office.

The Enforcement Division found that Rebecca Grajski successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (PREP) course regarding SEIs. In addition, amendments were filed to disclose the missing economic interest(s). For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action. Although the Enforcement Division is closing this matter without seeking a penalty, Rebecca Grajski is still required to pay any late filing fees assessed by their filing officer, the State Treasurer’s office.
