Dear Mr. Burba:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the "Act"). As you are aware, the Enforcement Division received a referral from the El Dorado County Clerk alleging that you failed to timely file your 2020 Annual Statement of Economic Interests ("SEI"). However, the Enforcement Division found that you left your position with the Lake Tahoe Community College District in July 2020.

When the Enforcement Division contacted you about the allegedly missing 2020 Annual SEI, you immediately responded to explain that you had stepped down as Director of Information Technology Services. It does not appear that the El Dorado County Clerk was aware you had left your position, and thus the County did not remind you to file a Leaving Office SEI.

You have since worked with the County to file the missing Leaving Office SEI. For this reason, we are closing this matter without further action. Although the Enforcement Division is closing this matter without seeking a penalty, you are still required to pay any late filing fees assessed by your filing officer, the El Dorado County Clerk.
