Dear Douglas Barth:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“FPPC”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a referral from the FPPC’s Statements of Economic Interests (“SEI”) Unit regarding your failure to timely file your 2019 Annual and Leaving Office SEIs for your position as a Planning Commissioner for the City of Paso Robles.

Upon receiving a letter from the Enforcement Division regarding the referrals, you contacted us to explain that you had filed your 2019 Annual and Leaving Office SEIs with the County of San Luis Obispo. The Enforcement Division found that you timely filed your 2019 Annual SEI and filed your Leaving Office SEI on February 22, 2021, before you were contacted by the Enforcement Division, however, the County did not forward the SEIs to the FPPC’s Enforcement Division.
