The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the "Act").¹ This letter is in response to a complaint you made regarding an attack website regarding Jim Cooper, a candidate for Sacramento County Sheriff in the June 7, 2022 Primary Election. After investigating and reviewing the case, the investigation was unable to determine who was responsible for the website. Therefore, there is insufficient evidence to support a finding there was a violation of the Act.
