No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2024-00123; Rick Hayashi

Dear Rick Hayashi:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a referral from the County of Santa Clara regarding your failure to timely file your 2021 Annual and Leaving Office Statements of Economic Interests (“SEIs”) for your position as an Assistant Principal with the Campbell Union High School District. Additionally, we received a referral regarding your failure to timely file your Assuming Office and 2022 Annual SEIs for your position as a Vice Principal for the Santa Clara Unified School District.

The Enforcement Division found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (PREP) course regarding SEIs. In addition, you have filed the missing SEI(s). For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action. Although the Enforcement Division is closing this matter without seeking a penalty, you are still required to pay any late filing fees assessed by your filing officer, the County of Santa Clara.
