No Action Closure Letter: FPPC No. 2023-00400; Jeff Gorell and Jeff Gorell for Supervisor 2022

Dear Jeff Gorell:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“FPPC”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a sworn complaint and non-sworn complaint alleging the office space provided to the Jeff Gorell for Supervisor 2022 committee (“Committee”) as a non-monetary contribution was reported under the fair market value. After conducting our review of this case, we are closing this matter without further action.

The Enforcement Division’s investigation determined the fair market value of the storage space was not undervalued, based on the condition of the space, the fact that it was under construction and was used for storage. While the Committee amended the date of one of the non-monetary contributions from May 7, 2022, to May 2, 2022, on the campaign statement for the reporting period April 24, 2022, through May 21, 2022, along with increasing the accrued expenses by \$148 on the amendment, the Enforcement Division is closing this case without further action because the activity is de minimis in scope, the disclosure of the non-monetary contribution was made prior to the relevant election, and the amendment was filed to correct the date of the non-monetary contribution and accrued expenses. As such, we are closing this matter without further action.
