No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2023-00822; Pandora Nash-Karner

Dear Pandora Nash-Karner,

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a sworn complaint alleging that you failed to disclose certain economic interests on your Assuming Office Statement of Economic Interests (“SEI”) for your position as a Commissioner with the San Luis Obispo County Parks and Recreation Commission.

The Enforcement Division found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (PREP) course regarding SEIs. In addition, you have filed an amendment to your SEI to disclose your reportable economic interests. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action.
