No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2024-00351, Brent Tercero

Dear Brent Tercero,

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“FPPC”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a referral from the Commission’s SEI Unit alleging that you failed to timely file your Leaving Office SEI for your position as a City Council Member for the City of Pico Rivera.

You recently contacted the Enforcement Division to explain that you believed you had met your filing obligations. You left your position with the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) on the same day you left your position as a City Council member. You filed your Leaving Office SEI for your SCAG position in January 2021, however, you failed to include your position as a City Council Member. You have since filed your Leaving Office SEI. For these reasons, the Enforcement Division is closing this matter without further action. Although the Enforcement Division is closing this matter without seeking a penalty, you are still required to pay any late filing fees assessed by your filing officer, the FPPC’s SEI Unit.
