No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2024-00107, Brian Affrunti

Dear Brian Affrunti,

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“FPPC”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to referrals from the Commission’s Statement of Economic Interests (“SEI”) Unit alleging that you failed to timely file your Assuming Office SEIs for your positions as Legal Counsel for the Shared Agency Risk Pool (SHARP) and Legal Counsel for the Pooled Liability Assurance Network Joint Powers Authority (PLAN JPA).

We have since learned that you did not receive the notifications from the Commission’s SEI Unit informing you of your outstanding Assuming Office SEIs. Additionally, you have since filed your Assuming Office SEIs. For these reasons, the Enforcement Division is closing this matter without further action. Although the Enforcement Division is closing this matter without seeking a penalty, you are still required to pay any late filing fees assessed by your filing officer, the Commission’s SEI Unit.
