No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2024-00362; California Voter Guide

Dear California Voter Guide:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the "Act").¹ This letter is in response to a sworn complaint that alleged you included an asterisk next to a candidate's name in your slate mailer who did not pay to be included in the slate mailer. After our investigation and review of the case, the Enforcement Division has found insufficient evidence of a violation of the Act. The evidence shows that the candidate's information and payment were provided to the CVG by the Chair of the Riverside County Republican Party, and under the circumstances, CVG believed that the candidate at issue was involved. Additionally, it appears that the candidate was working with the Chair of the Riverside County Republican Party regarding their campaign. Therefore, we are closing this matter without further action.
