No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2024-00652; John Bakker

Dear John Bakker:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a referral from the County of Santa Clara alleging that you failed to timely file your 2019 Annual, 2020 Annual, 2021 Annual, 2022 Annual, and Leaving Office Statements of Economic Interests (“SEIs”) for your position as District Counsel for the West Valley Sanitation District.

The Enforcement Division found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (PREP) course regarding SEIs. In addition, you have filed the missing SEIs. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action.

Moreover, completion of PREP exempts you from paying late filing fees for the violations listed in the PREP Agreement, i.e., failure to timely file 2019 Annual, 2020 Annual, 2021 Annual, 2022 Annual, and Leaving Office SEIs, assessed by your filing officer, the County of Santa Clara, pursuant to Section 91013.
