No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2024-00932; Jose Luis Barajas

Dear All:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a complaint alleging that Jose Barajas failed to timely disclose certain economic interests on their Assuming Office Statement of Economic Interests (“SEI”) and 2021, 2022, and 2023 Annual SEIs for their position as a Measure E Oversight Committee Member for the City of Salinas and a Housing Advisory Committee Member for Monterey County.

The Enforcement Division found that Jose Barajas successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (“PREP”) course regarding SEIs. In addition, they filed amendments to their SEIs to properly disclose reportable economic interests. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action.
