**No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2024-01349; Justina Walch**

Dear Justina Walch:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).<sup>1</sup> This letter is in response to a referral from the County of Santa Clara regarding your failure to timely file your Leaving Office Statement of Economic Interests (“SEI”) for your position as a Principal with ACE Charter Schools.

The Enforcement Division recently contacted you, and you explained that you did not receive the notifications sent by the County of Santa Clara regarding your requirement to file the Leaving Office SEI because they went to your spam folder. You have since filed the Leaving Office SEI. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action. Although the Enforcement Division is closing this matter without seeking a penalty, you are still required to pay any late filing fees assessed by your filing officer, the County of Santa Clara.
