No Action Closure Letter Re: FPPC No. 2024-00199; No Recall, Parents Protecting our Kids Against the Recall of OUSD Boardmembers

Dear Jen Slater:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to complaints that alleged an unknown sender failed to include proper disclosures on ads sent in October 2023. After conducting our investigation and review of the case, the Enforcement Division was unable to confirm who was responsible for the mailers and the associated costs, thus there is insufficient evidence to prove a violation of the Act for these advertisements. Therefore, we are closing this matter without further action.
