No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2024-00858; Joe Sangirardi, Stacey Owens, Peter Sullivan and Sangirardi for BART Board 2024

Dear Joe Sangirardi, Stacey Owens, Peter Sullivan, and Committee:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a sworn complaint alleging that you failed to file Form 460 Semi-Annual Campaign Statement for the reporting periods July 1, 2023 through December 31, 2024, and January 1, 2024 through June 30, 2024. Additionally, the complainant alleged that the Committee failed to timely file a Statement of Organization and Candidate Intention Statement.

The Enforcement Division found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (PREP) campaign course. In addition, you have filed, in the correct jurisdiction, the above listed Semi-Annual, Organization, and Candidate Intention Statements.
