No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2024-01283; Thomas Philp

Dear Thomas Philp:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a referral from the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California alleging that you failed to timely file your Leaving Office Statement of Economic Interests (“SEI”) for your position as a Strategic Communication and Policy Advisor with the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California.

The Enforcement Division recently contacted you, and you explained that you did not receive the notifications mailed by the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California regarding your requirement to file the Leaving Office SEI. You have since filed the Leaving Office SEI. Although the Enforcement Division is closing this matter without seeking a penalty, you are still required to pay any late filing fees assessed by your filing officer, the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California.
