No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2024-01031; Joanna Lee

Dear Joanna Lee:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a referral from the Department of Financial Protection and Innovation (“DFPI”) alleging that you failed to timely file your 2023 Annual Statement of Economic Interests (“SEI”) for your position as a Financial Institutions Examiner for DFPI.

The Enforcement Division sent you a letter in October 2024 regarding your failure to file a 2023 Annual SEI. You contacted us to explain that you had been out on extended leave at the time the 2023 Annual SEI was due. DFPI confirmed that you were out on leave when their notifications regarding your requirement to file the 2023 Annual SEI were sent to your work email address, to which you did not have access. You have since filed your 2023 Annual SEI. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action.
