No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC Case No. 2020-00732; Washington Unified School District

Gentlepersons:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act.¹ This case arises from a Commission-initiated investigation based on information received through the Enforcement Division's AdWatch program. The information involved a survey/poll, allegedly paid for by the Washington Unified School District. The survey/poll pertained to a bond measure known as Measure Z, which was on the ballot in November 2020.

We investigated to determine if the survey/poll qualified as a "push poll" advertisement—in which case it would need to abide by the Act's advertising "paid for by" rules. However, we found insufficient evidence of a violation of the Act, and we are closing this case without further action.
