No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2024-00516, Julian Del Real-Calleros

Dear Julian Del Real-Calleros,

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“FPPC”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a referral from the FPPC’s Statement of Economic Interests (“SEI”) Unit alleging that you failed to timely file your 2021 Annual SEI for your position as a Planning Commissioner with the City of Lynwood.

We have since learned that you left your position in October 2021. Since you left your position in October 2021, you were not required to file the 2021 Annual SEI. Additionally, you have since filed your Leaving Office SEI. For these reasons, the Enforcement Division is closing this matter without further action. Although the Enforcement Division is closing this matter without seeking a penalty, you are still required to pay any late filing fees assessed by your filing officer, the FPPC’s SEI Unit.
