No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2024-00743; Larry Rice

Dear Larry Rice:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a referral from the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors alleging that you failed to timely file your 2022 Annual Statement of Economic Interests (“SEI”) for your position as a Board Member for the Pacific Gateway Workforce Development Board.

The Enforcement Division found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (PREP) course regarding SEIs. In addition, you have filed the missing SEI. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action.

Moreover, completion of PREP exempts you from paying late filing fees for the violations listed in the PREP Agreement, i.e., failure to timely file 2022 Annual SEI, assessed by your filing officer, the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors, pursuant to Section 91013.
