No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2024-00603; Tom Madigan

Dear Tom Madigan:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“FPPC”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to referrals from the Commission’s Statement of Economic Interests (“SEI”) Unit regarding your failure to timely file a 2021 Annual and 2022 Annual SEI for your position as an Alternate Board Member for the Bay Area Regional Interoperable Communications System Authority. However, we have since learned that you left that position in March 2022.

Since you left your position in March 2022, you were not required to file the 2022 Annual SEI. Additionally, the Enforcement Division has also learned that you never attended a Board meeting, and you filed the 2021 Annual and Leaving Office SEIs immediately after you were contacted by the Enforcement Division.
