No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC Case No. 2022-00892; Gino Kwok; Gino Kwok for HLPUSD Board 2022; Yolanda Miranda

Gentlepersons:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act.¹ This case arises from a sworn complaint and two anonymous complaints regarding Mr. Kwok's successful 2022 election campaign for Hacienda La Puente Unified School District, Area No. 4. The complaints included allegations that you: accepted campaign contributions from a dissolved business entity; expended campaign funds for improper purposes; did not report the full addresses, occupation, and employer information for some of your donors.

However, these allegations have been disproven, and we are closing this case without further action. Thank you for your attention to this matter. Do not hesitate to call if you have any questions.
