No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2024-00984; Paloma Anguiano

Dear Paloma Anguiano:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a referral from the County of San Diego alleging that you failed to timely file your Assuming Office Statement of Economic Interests (“SEI”) for your position as a Member of the Board of Directors for the Metropolitan Area Advisory Committee Community Charter School.

The Enforcement Division found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (PREP) course regarding SEIs. In addition, you have filed the missing SEI. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action.

Moreover, completion of PREP exempts you from paying late filing fees for the violations listed in the PREP Agreement, i.e., failure to timely file the Assuming Office SEI, assessed by your filing officer, the County of San Diego, pursuant to Section 91013.
