Warning Letter Re: FPPC No. 2024-00240, Rex Fieck

Dear Rex Fieck:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the "Act").¹ This letter is sent in response to a referral from the Santa Clara County Filing Officer alleging you failed to timely file your Assuming Office and Leaving Office SEIs as a Program Manager for Santa Clara Valley Healthcare.

The Act requires that that within 30 days of assuming and leaving office, every person must file an assuming and leaving office SEI disclosing the person's investments, interests in real property, and income during the period since the previous statement was filed.²

Upon review, the Enforcement Division determined that you left your position on September 15, 2023 and never received notice of your duty to file your SEIs. The Enforcement Division confirmed that you promptly filed your Assuming and Leaving Office SEIs upon Enforcement contact. The Enforcement Division determined you violated the Act by failing to timely file your Assuming and Leaving Office SEIs within 30 days of assuming and leaving your position as a Program Manager. However, mitigating circumstances exist here: you never received notice of your duty to file SEIs, the SEI filings were filed, you had no reportable interests, and you have no prior Enforcement history.

This letter serves as a written warning. The information in this matter will be retained and may be considered should an enforcement action become necessary based on newly discovered information or future conduct. Failure to comply with the provisions of the Act in the future will result in monetary penalties of up to \$5,000 for each violation.

A warning letter is an Enforcement Division case resolution without administrative prosecution or fine. The Commission has adopted Regulation 18360.1 to authorize the

Enforcement Division to issue warning letters to conclude cases in specified circumstances. However, the warning letter resolution does not provide you with the opportunity for a probable cause hearing or hearing before an Administrative Law Judge or the Commission. If you wish to avail yourself of these proceedings by requesting that your case proceed with prosecution rather than a warning, please notify us within ten (10) days from the date of this letter. Upon this notification, the Enforcement Division will rescind this warning letter and proceed with administrative prosecution of this case. If we do not receive such notification, this warning letter will be posted on the Commission's website ten (10) days from the date of this letter.
