No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2024-01037; Nelson for Citrus Heights City Council 2024 and Kelsey Nelson

Dear Respondents:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a sworn complaint indicating that you failed to timely file an amendment to your statement of organization upon qualifying as a committee, and failed to timely file a 24-hour contribution report.

The Enforcement Division found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (PREP) course regarding campaigns for local/state candidates and candidate-controlled committees. In addition, you have filed the missing campaign statements. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action.

Moreover, completion of PREP exempts you from paying late filing fees for the violations listed in the PREP Agreement, assessed by your filing officer, City of Citrus Heights, pursuant to Section 91013.
