No Action Closure Letter re FPPC No. 2024-01237; Beau Reynolds

Dear Beau Reynolds:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a sworn complaint alleging that you failed to timely file the Assuming Office Statement of Economic Interests (SEI), as well as annual SEIs since 2020.

The Enforcement Division found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (PREP) course regarding Statements of Economic Interests. For this reason, we are closing this matter without further action.

Moreover, completion of PREP exempts you from paying late filing fees for the violations listed in the PREP Agreement (i.e., failure to timely file your Assuming Office SEI by January 18, 2021, 2021 Annual SEI by April 1, 2022, 2022 Annual SEI by April 3, 2023, 2023 Annual SEI by April 2, 2024, and 2024 Annual SEI by April 1, 2025) assessed by your filing officer, the Registrar of Voters, County of Sacramento, pursuant to Section 91013.
