No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2025-00202; Melvin Vaughn

Dear Melvin Vaughn:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a referral from the County of Santa Clara alleging that you failed to timely file your 2022 Annual and Leaving Office Statements of Economic Interests (“SEIs”) for your position as a Member of the Board of Commissioners for the Los Altos Hills County Fire District (“District”).

Following our review of the matter, there is insufficient evidence to support a finding that you failed to timely file the 2022 Annual and Leaving Office SEIs with the District.
