No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2024-00400; Casey Rusca

Dear Casey Rusca:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a referral from California Correctional Health Care Services alleging that you failed to timely file your 2020 Annual Statement of Economic Interests (“SEI”) for your position as a Clinical Psychologist for California Correctional Health Care Services.

The Enforcement Division found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (PREP) course regarding SEIs. In addition, you have filed the missing SEI. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action.

Pursuant to Section 91013, completion of PREP exempts you from paying late filing fees assessed by your filing officer for the violations listed in the PREP Agreement, i.e., 2020 Annual SEI.
