No Action Closure Letter re: El Monte Leadership Council; FPPC Case No. 2020-01001

Dear Committee:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a sworn complaint alleging El Monte Leadership Council (ID# 1429154) (the “Committee”) failed to include the required disclosure on advertisements on the Committee’s Facebook page and that it coordinated with another committee, Citizens for a Return to a Safe, Stable and Normal California (ID#1428902). After conducting our investigation and review of the case, we are closing this matter without further action.

Our investigation determined the Committee was not responsible for and did not authorize the advertisements in question. Additionally, the investigation found no evidence that the Committee coordinated with Citizens for a Return to a Safe, Stable and Normal California in the payment or production of the advertisements. Based on these findings, the Enforcement Division has concluded there is insufficient evidence to support a finding that you violated the Act.
