No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC Case No. 2024-01222; Melanie Freeberg, Melanie Freeberg for NHUSD Board 2024, and Ramon Cusi

Dear Respondents:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a non-sworn complaint alleging that you failed to timely file the first pre-election campaign statement and a 24-hour contribution report in connection with the November 5, 2024 General Election.

The Enforcement Division found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (PREP) course regarding Campaign for Local Candidates and Candidate-Controlled Committees. In addition, you have filed the missing campaign statements. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action.

Moreover, completion of PREP exempts you from paying late filing fees for the violations listed in the PREP Agreement (i.e., failure to timely file pre-election campaign statements and 24-hour contribution reports), assessed by your filing officer, the Alameda County Clerk, pursuant to Section 91013.
