No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2025-00520; Eric Turlak

Dear Eric Turlak:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“FPPC”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a referral from the Office of Energy Infrastructure Safety regarding your failure to timely file your Assuming Office and Leaving Office Statements of Economic Interests (“SEIs”) for your position as an Associate Governmental Program Analyst (Investigation) to the Underground Infrastructure Directorate.

The Enforcement Division recently contacted you, and you explained that you did not receive the notifications regarding your Assuming Office and Leaving Office SEIs. Specifically, the Office of Energy Infrastructure Safety emailed the first Assuming Office SEI notification to a misspelled email address and did not re-send notifications to the correct agency email address until after you left office. Additionally, the Leaving Office SEI notifications that were sent to your personal email address went to your spam folder. You have since filed your Assuming Office and Leaving Office SEIs. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action. Although the Enforcement Division is closing this matter without seeking a penalty, you are still required to pay any late filing fees assessed by your filing officer, the Office of Energy Infrastructure Safety.
