No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2025-00260, Michael Butler

Dear Michael Butler,

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“FPPC”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a referral from the Santa Clara County Clerk of the Board of Supervisors alleging that you failed to timely file your 2023 Annual Statement of Economic Interests (“SEI”) for your position as a Construction/ Building Manager with the Evergreen School District.

We have since learned that you left the position in March 2024. It appears the notifications sent to you by Santa Clara County were sent to your former agency’s email address after you left the position. Additionally, you have since filed the 2023 Annual and Leaving Office SEIs. For these reasons, the Enforcement Division is closing this matter without further action. Although the Enforcement Division is closing this matter without seeking a penalty, you are still required to pay any late filing fees assessed by your filing officer, the Santa Clara County Clerk of the Board of Supervisors.
