No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2025-00707; Erin Wilson, Erin Wilson for Hart District Board Trustee Area 4 2024

Dear Erin Wilson and Committee:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to an anonymous complaint alleging that you failed to timely file four 24-Hour Reports for contributions received of \$1,000 or more.

The Enforcement Division found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (PREP) course regarding Campaign for Local Candidates and Candidate-Controlled Committees. In addition, you have filed the missing 24-Hour Reports. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action.

Moreover, completion of PREP exempts you from paying late filing fees for the violations listed in the PREP Agreement (i.e., failure to timely file 24-Hour Reports), assessed by your filing officer, Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk, pursuant to Section 91013.
