No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC Case No. 2025-00507; Villa SCUSD Trustee Area 4 2020, Jamee Villa

Dear Jamee Villa and Committee:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a referral from the County of Sacramento alleging that you failed to timely file several Semi-Annual (Form 460) campaign statements by their respective deadlines.

The Enforcement Division found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (PREP) course regarding Campaign for Local Candidates and Candidate-Controlled Committees. In addition, you have filed the missing campaign statements. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action.

Moreover, completion of PREP exempts you from paying late filing fees for the violations listed in the PREP Agreement (i.e., failure to timely file Semi-Annual Campaign Statements), assessed by your filing officer, the County of Sacramento, pursuant to Section 91013.
